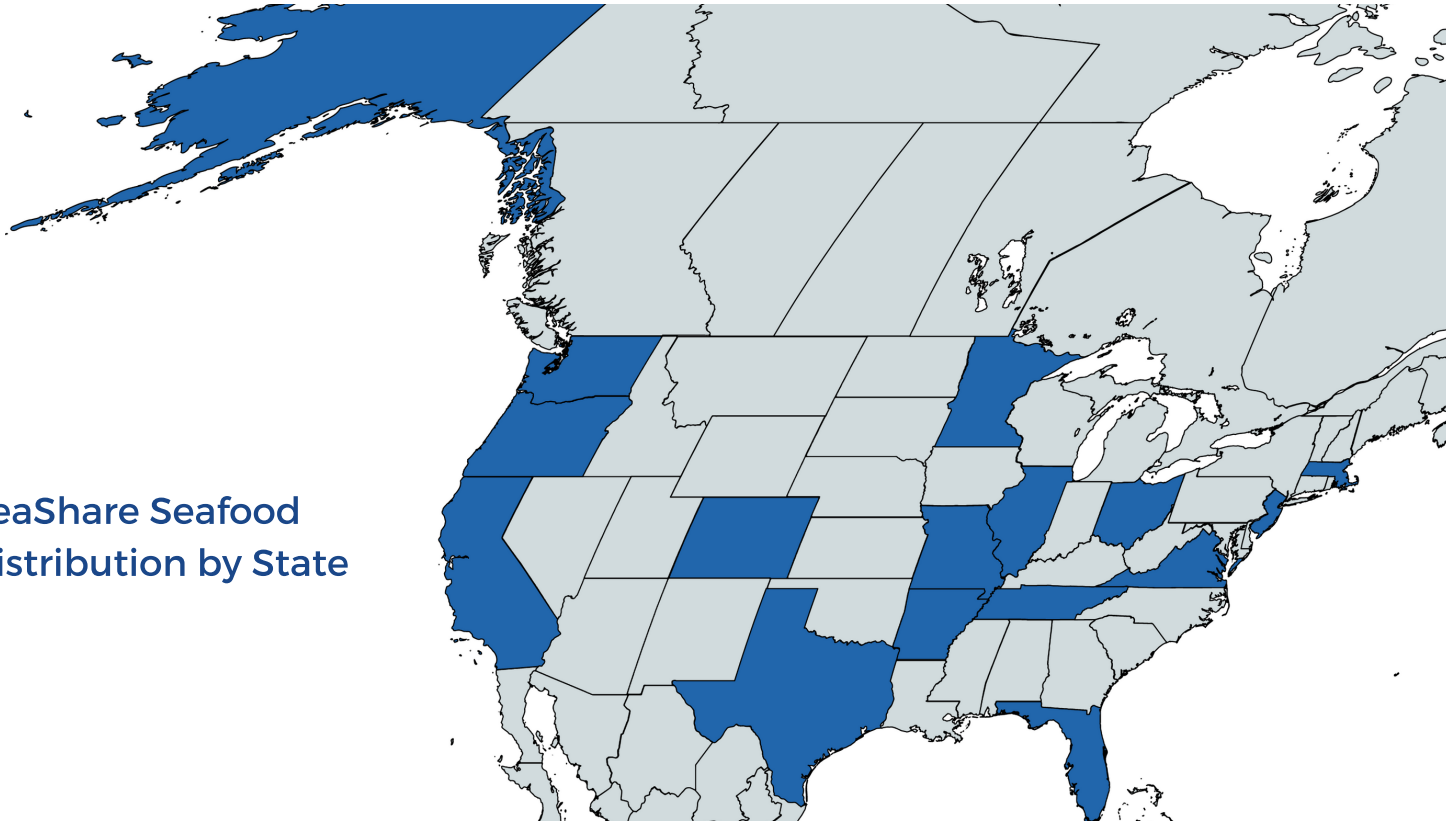

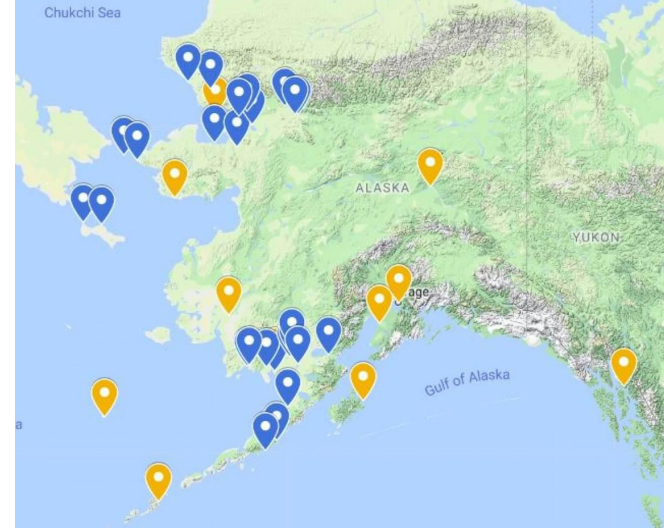
# Where we worked in 2019

# 2019 Highlights

Our collective work was spread over 16 states in 2019, and we are particularly proud of the work that has been done in Alaska. Seafood has dietary and cultural significance for rural Alaskans. Since 2016, SeaShare has invested over \$200,000 to improve the storage and distribution of frozen foods across the state. In 2019 we donated over 850,000 servings of nutritious seafood across Alaska, all at zero cost to the receiving agencies. We have now purchased, filled and installed freezers in five locations:



Communities impacted by SeaShare's seafood distribution.

**Dillingham:** BBNA continues to distribute our seafood throughout Bristol Bay.

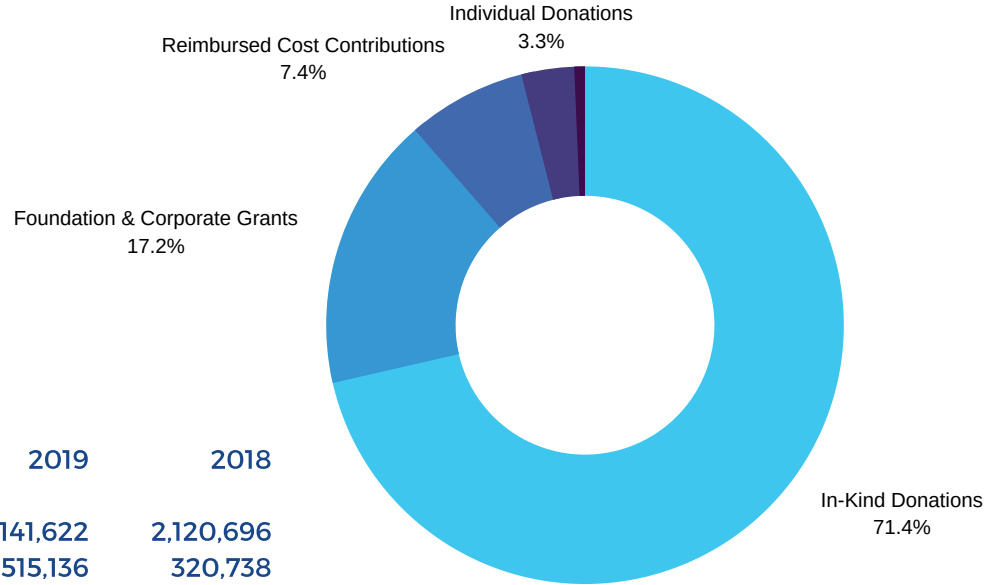
**St. Paul:** The local food bank uses the freezer provided by SeaShare to receive salmon every year from Dutch Harbor processors, via Coastal Transportation.

**Bethel:** The Lion's Club Food Bank maintains the 40-foot freezer SeaShare provided in 2018. Lynden Air freight carried 20,000 pounds of seafood in spring of 2019 to fill it.

**Kodiak:** When the Salvation Army took over food bank duties in Kodiak last year, SeaShare provided a new freezer to store locally donated seafood.

**Juneau:** The Southeast Alaska Food Bank is the latest partner to receive a freezer container from SeaShare. AML carried 20,000 pounds of frozen fish to the food bank last fall.

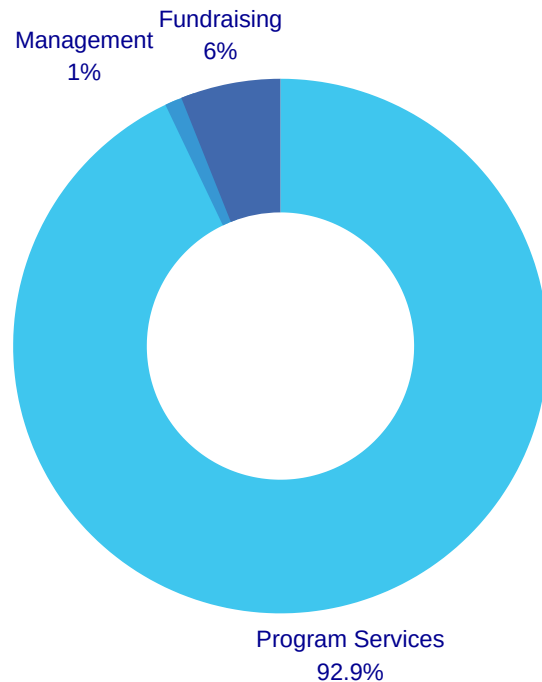
