2021 was a challenging year for everyone who works to feed people. Like the rest of the seafood industry, SeaShare faced new challenges to keep products flowing, shelves filled, and people fed. We were fortunate to find new seafood partners from Bristol Bay to New England. Feeding America continued to adapt and respond, working with us to distribute food across an expanding network. And key financial partners recognized the value that nutritious seafood adds to hunger-relief during COVID. We are thankful for their generous grants. Additional support allowed us to access another tier of seafood products that would otherwise be out of reach for the families we all serve.

The Prohibited Species Donation Program, begun in 1994, has now generated over 25 million servings from fish that would

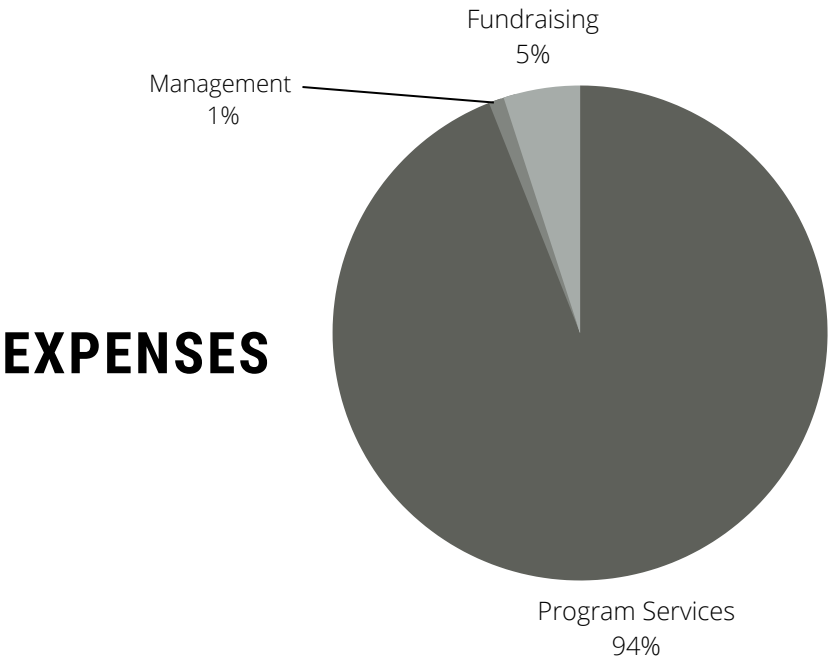
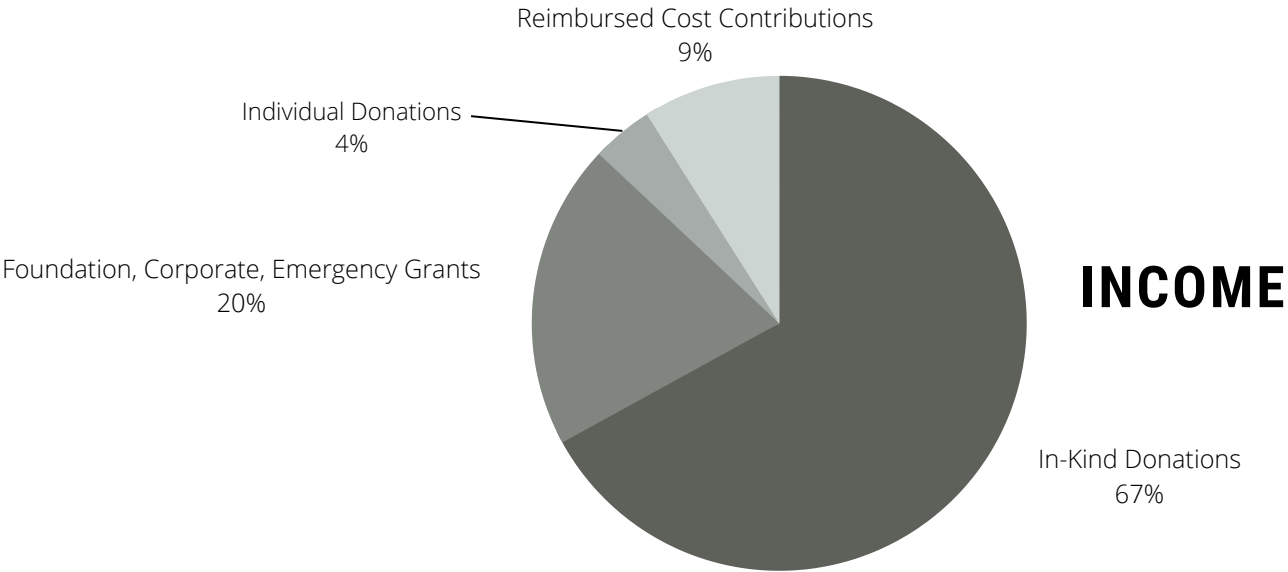
otherwise be thrown overboard. The success of that effort led to other donation programs that continue to provide important results for communities across the country as well. SeaShare has distributed over 14 million seafood servings over the last two years. In the second half of 2021 we saw that inventories were tightening, and all food prices were rising. Together, we are reducing waste and providing important nutrition to a segment of the population that needs all the health benefits that seafood offers.

2022 will undoubtedly present new challenges. 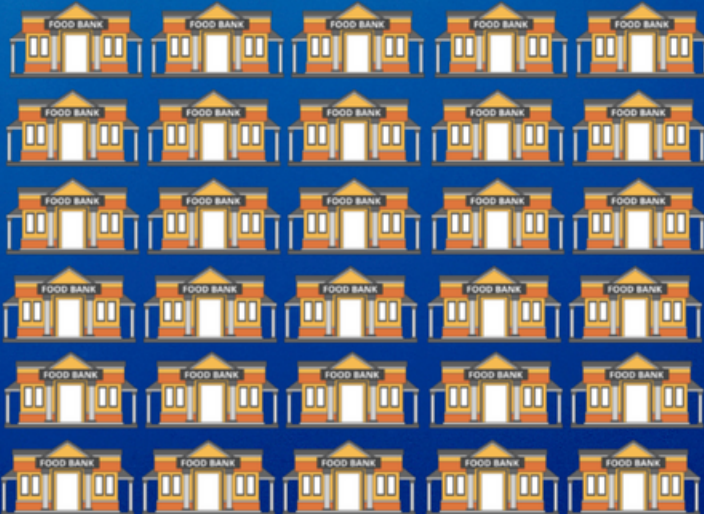

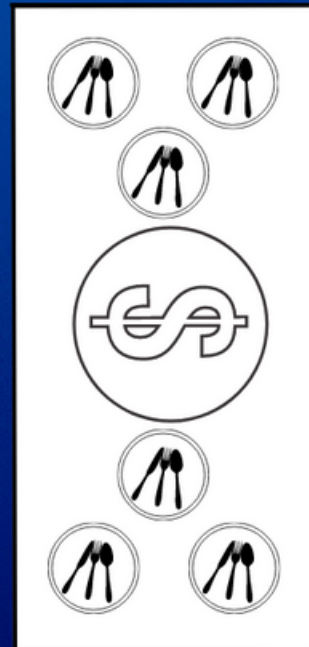

COAST TO COAST DISTRIBUTION
